

Roero Arneis DOCG Le Tre - Malabaila

The Producer:

Piemontese through and through, the Malabaila family can trace their roots in Roero back as far as 1270 and now own 22ha of vineyards and producing 100,000 bottles a year. They've been producing Roero Arneis DOCG since 1985 bringing the grapes back to the cellar as opposed to being used as distraction for birds so they wouldn't eat the Nebbiolo crop. The Malabaila estate is a stone's throw away of the possible origin of the name of the Arneis variety - Bric Renesio. Very possibly wines from Arneis grapes have been produced on the land since the 13th century.

The Wine:

Grape(s): 100% Arneis
Area: Roero Arneis DOCG, Piedmont
Harvest: Hand-harvested in maximum 18kg boxes. 1000kg p/ha
Vinification: Whole bunch so-pressing, then controlled temperature in stainless steel
Ageing: Stainless steel

Tasting Notes:

- Intense bouquet of white flowers, fleshy peaches and green apples. Dry and floral on the palate enveloping the mouth with flavours of white peaches.
